The Day That Changed My Life

Meet Jazmin and hear her story of determination and perseverance. She has come so far, thanks to you!

My mom was murdered. Wrong place, wrong time. It led to my homelessness. At first, I rented a hotel room with my girls and son. It was \$90 a night. I couldn't keep doing that. I called their grandma and their dad and said, "It's time I get back on my feet." They drove 16 hours and picked them up. I told the kids that I'd see them later. I was frozen. My feet were frozen. My hands were frozen. It hurt to walk. A nice police officer said, "We have a place that you can go to." They helped me get into Stepping Stone. When I got there, they were really nice. They fed me and let me search through the clothing closet.

That was a day that changed my life... otherwise, I don't know where I'd be right now. I was outside and it was eight degrees.

It's not hard for me now. I have a plan to achieve my goal. By this summer, I plan to have my own place with room for my kids. I have three month goals and six month goals. As long as you're doing your plan, you will move forward.

This shelter is an actual stepping stone back into a new life.

Currently, I have a full-time job and live at Blaine House* with two other past residents. I am saving for my own place and to give my kids a future. To be a family again. That's what I am working for. I am healing every day, one-step at a time. "I was frozen. My feet were frozen. My hands were frozen.

It hurt to walk."

*Stepping Stone was able to purchase a three-bedroom home from Anoka County for \$1 and had volunteers do a renovation. This house serves as a vital stepping stone for some of our residents to create a positive credit history, and get real-life rental experience while continuing their journey towards self-reliance.
