HEALING COMES THROUGH YOUR SUPPORT

A downward spiral causes a grandma to lose all hope.



Stepping Stone was a last resort. Everything had been ok in my life. I had a normal life with an apartment, a twelve-month lease, a job. But with my baby granddaughter's death, my whole life changed. And it changed very quickly. I sunk into a very deep grief very quickly.

I had buried a grandbaby and her mother, my daughter, had begun using again, and so she lost her other daughter to child protective services. So I lost another granddaughter after just having buried one. I entered this downward spiral and couldn't believe how fast things changed. My lease was up and I lost my apartment.

Then I lost my job. I just couldn't focus - there was so much going on in my life. But rock bottom was when I stopped eating, stopped sleeping, just stopped functioning for 30 days. My doctor asked me if I had done any of the things he told me I needed to do, and I said no, I hadn't. He said I needed grief support. And he said to call Stepping Stone.

I called Stepping Stone, and they had a bed. I didn't want to, but I didn't want to be sleeping in my car. It was just so different here. There is such an array of different personalities and different people, and it was scary. I wanted to run.

But the light here, my hope here came from my case manager. She helped me set goals and begin to move forward. I started a new job and started making progress. I had to learn boundaries. I learned that you can be kind but don't have to be friends.

And it would have been easy to just sit in my bed all day and be lethargic. But if you have a mind and a body and ability, it may seem hopeless, but it is worth it to keep moving forward.

My case manager made sure I took responsibility for my actions. The suggestions were always there, "maybe you could do this," or "maybe this is a good next step". But I always had to do it for myself. The support has always been here and available.

I really did find healing, true honest healing. My mind, body, and spirit were finally given the time to grieve, to think things through, to let things go.

The biggest lesson I learned while staying at Stepping Stone was that not one person is more important than the next. We are all deserving - people deserving of dignity, honor, respect; especially dignity. No matter your family of origin, your race, your background, we are all worthy of dignity.

Did you know?

Eighty-four percent of your donation goes directly into the programming that gives our residents the chance they need to win their personal fight against homelessness. Programming includes a warm, safe place to sleep with basic needs met, working one-on-one with each individual to identify the cause of their homelessness, and helping them develop a personalized plan to move toward self-reliance. COMMUNITY PARTNERS HELP FILL A NEED (AND BELLIES!)

Stepping Stone has had an exciting fall and winter! We acquired the second floor of our building and have been under renovations for several months. We were informed by our contractor, that during the week between Christmas and New Year, the water would be turned off due to plumbing upgrades. We knew we could move all our residents to a nearby hotel during this week, but we would not have access to our kitchen, which created a problem.

With three meals a day for each resident and no kitchen to do meal prep, we reached out to catering companies and Unique Dining was in a position and ready to help. Two hot meals a day would be provided. Our next step was to cover this unplanned expense.

Coon Rapids Chrysler Dodge Jeep Ram had already held an in-house fundraiser and given Stepping Stone a very generous check mid-November for holiday meals. Their donation was so bountiful, that we had extra funds left over, and they were happy to let us use what was left toward the catered meals. Unique Dining donated two of the meals,

while Wold Architects and Morcon Construction happily picked up the rest of the tab. If you've ever eaten at Courtyards of Andover (Unique Dining is their parent company), then you know our residents had a scrumptious week of meals!

Stepping Stone is always grateful for the outpouring and unselfish care our community gives to the residents. You are our community and we would not be able to fulfill our vision to, "provide a safe and inclusive community response to ending homelessness for all" without you.
